PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

President Sid Guinane thanked General Manager John McMahon and the office staff for all their support during the past year. Sid also thanked Course Superintendent Cameron Dunn and all the course staff for their outstanding work in at times horrendous circumstances in the second half of the last financial year which has also carried over to this year.

Sid said it is full credit to Cameron and his staff to have the course back as well as many times as they have.

Sid also thanked the course volunteers for all their work led by John Clarke, Brett Carden, Roger Walsh, Sid Parris, Les Schwab, Ken Brunker, Paul Lesmond and the late Graham Johnston. John and his team work on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays every week.

Sid thanked all the Club Board Members for their support over the last 12 months.

Moved: A. Lohman Seconded: J. Clarke The President's Report as presented is accepted.

ADOPTION OF THE BALANCE SHEET:

Treasurer Phil McColl presented the financial report for the year ended 30th June 2022.

Phil noted that we have two entities in Woolooware Golf Club and Woolooware Golf Course Management. Woolooware Golf Course Management at the end of the financial year had approximately \$850,000.00 in cash reserves taking into account wet weather, lockdowns and limited carts on the course.

Phil said what the report does not show is that in January there was \$1.2 million in the bank and as of now the bank balance is back to \$850,000.00. For this reason, we have been a bit cautious with our expenditures and making sure we have money in the bank to cover wages. Overall, the course is going ok considering the weather and condition of the course.

The Club House returned a profit of \$200,000.00 which was excellent considering the year started in lockdown and the government subsidies were no longer available. Looking back through history:

2019 (loss of \$70,000.00) 2020 (nil profit) 2021 (profit of \$737,000)

On that basis and with a normal trading year we might be looking at a profit of \$300,000.00 taking into account the reopening of Cronulla Sharks.

Dave Gray asked if there was any information on Sharks and if were there any plans in place for when they open.

General Manager John McMahon said his information was that the Sharks would open up in October/November 2023. Part of our plans to compete with the Sharks was the introduction of the Club Courtesy Bus to run on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights from 5 pm to 9 pm. This will commence on Thursday 24th November and will be a free service.

Moved: I. RoachSeconded: R. AndersonThe Treasurer's Report as presented be approved.

ORDINARY RESOLUTIONS:

The first Ordinary Resolution relates to Director's benefits and expenses during the 12-month period preceding the 2023 Annual General Meeting.

Members further acknowledge that these benefits and expenses are not available to Members generally but only to those members who are elected Directors of the Club and approved in a sum not exceeding \$15,000.00.

This is a requirement under the Registered Club's Act, for the members to consider and if thought fit, pass.

#Ash Lohman raised whether the Directors amount should be increased to reflect the cost of mixing socially and buying some

drinks each month for the Cronulla people making them feel part of the club.

Sid Guinane said there is an allowance in this budget for Directors' spending on items like this.

John McMahon said it is covered in Clause 9: "The reasonable cost of meals and refreshments associated with Directors and their partners entertaining guests of the Club on special occasions."

Moved: D. Gray Seconded: S. Smith Ordinary Resolution No.1 be approved.

The Second Ordinary Resolution relates to ongoing Club expenses in a sum not exceeding \$70,000.00 during the 12month period preceding the 2023 Annual General Meeting. Resolution No.2 includes expenses for: Induction evenings for new members Sponsorship of sporting events and charity days Cadet/Junior Development Programs Green and competition fees for current life members Men's and Women's pennant teams.

This is a requirement under the Registered Club's Act, for the members to consider and if thought fit, pass.

Moved: A. Dove Seconded: P. Hankin Ordinary Resolution No.2 be approved.

Carried.

Dave Gray suggested we could look into some fundraising activities such as raffles to assist with the expense.

John McMahon advised that \$20,000.00 was received each year from Schweppes as sponsorship for the pennant teams.

John McMahon confirmed that the courtesy bus would be available for use by the women's and men's pennant teams.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP NOMINATION:

General Manager John McMahon advised the meeting that a life membership nomination has been received for club member Phil Hayes. The nomination meets all the relevant criteria as per the club constitution of Woolooware Golf Club. The nomination was tabled and approved at the Club Board of Directors meeting held on 31st March 2022 (Minute 18/22) to be presented at the AGM for the approval of members present at the meeting.

The nomination was put to the members present to vote on and was approved by in excess of the required 75% of members present and entitled to vote on the resolution. # Rohan Hayes accepted the life membership certificate on behalf of his late father Phil Hayes.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

Les Schwab said he has managed the Super Seniors and B Grade Pennant teams this year. Les said we should look at running some raffles to assist with the expenses as some of the clubs turn up in full uniforms and our players just turn up in what they have to wear.

Sid Guinane said we need to market and advertise the pennant teams to all our members with Mitch Rugless and Trish Huthwaite along with the M&H Committee currently reviewing this. Sid said all members are welcome to attend meetings for their input.

Sid Guinane spoke on the Cook Community Raffle run each year by Scott Morrisons Office. The proceeds of all tickets sold come directly back to the golf course. The Vets purchase \$3,000.00 each year and a discussion was held on selling the tickets to all members and visitors to the club:

Ash Lohman- add \$2.00 to green fees.

Greg Smith- advertise the books to members.

Alan Dove – tickets purchased through your member house account.

Dave Gray – increase member fees by \$20 with a box to be ticked on the renewal.

John Stoffels said the recent Peter Lehmann wine and dinner night held at the club was a great night. Everyone really enjoyed themselves and said the club should look at putting similar nights on in the future.

Mitch Rugless spoke on the Sutherland Shire Golf Championship with Cronulla, Woolooware and The Ridge to be involved. The first day is in December this year with the event having the Club Champions, Women, Men and Juniors competing against each other.

Mitch said that Brian Shipway has been the organizer with Brad Ulph securing sponsorship for Woolooware and the expense is only minor for all clubs.

Peter Hankin said that Brian Shipway should be recognized in some way for all his efforts in putting the competition together.

With no further business the meeting was closed at 7.39 pm.

Operating Results

The profit of the company for the financial year after providing for income tax amounted to \$679,328.

Principal activities

The principal activities of the company during the course of the financial year were the operation and management of the licensed golf club, which included the provision of golfing and recreational facilities to members of the company. There were no significant changes in the nature of the activities of the company during the year.

Objectives

The objectives of the company are to remain committed to the highest possible standards, in delivering services and facilities to our members and their guests, as well as the development of the sport of golf within the Sutherland Shire. It is our mission to provide the best facilities available for as many people as possible, to enjoy the game of golf at minimum cost, by fostering participation in the sport at all levels.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Information on Concise Financial Report

The concise financial report is an extract from the full financial report of Woolooware Golf Club Limited and its controlled entity. The financial statements and disclosures in the concise financial report have been derived from the full year financial report of Woolooware Golf Club Limited and its controlled entity. A copy of the full financial report and auditor's report will be sent to any member, free of charge upon request.

The discussion and analyis is based on the full year financial report of Woolooware Golf Club Limited and its controlled entity and is provided to assist members in understanding the concise financial report.

Income Statement

The company's total revenue increased by \$1,789,798 (35.3%) compared to the prior year. Expenses have increased by \$1,263,844 (25.7%) resulting in a net profit of \$679,328 compared with a net profit of \$153,374 in the prior year.

Individual items which impacted on the results include:

- Revenue from bar trade increased by \$940,774 (66.5%) to \$2,355,508
- Revenue from net poker machine takings increased by \$406,925 (66.0%) to \$1,023,526
- Government subsidies decreased by \$61,605 to nil
- Course income increased by \$188,437 (12.5%) to \$1,700,151
- Pro Shop income increased by \$263,177 (34.0%) to \$1,036,785
- Depreciation increased by \$39,852 (6.3%) to \$674,014
- Finance costs decreased by \$22,969 (28.2%) to \$58,567
- Course maintenance costs increased by \$127,532 (113.8%) to \$239,648

Balance Sheet

The movement in net assets of the company is a result of an increase in total assets of \$579,550, and a decrease in total liabilities of \$99,778.

The material items contributing to the movements this year include:

- Increase in cash & cash equivalents of \$569,682 (32.8%)
- Increase in written down value of property, plant & equipment of \$68,853 (2.5%)
- Decrease in right-of-use assets of \$126,753 (20.7%)
- Decrease in financial liabilities of \$169,084 (48.6%)
- Decrease in operating lease liabilities of \$131,030 (18.8%)

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Cash Flow Statement

The net increase in cash held was \$569,682 resulting in total cash and cash equivalents of \$2,305,966. The main drivers of the movements for the year are as follows:

Net cash from operating activities

There was an increase in net cash inflows from operating activities of \$490,703 resulting in positive cashflows from operating activities of \$1,536,913 compared to \$1,046,210 in prior year. This was attributed to an increase in receipts from customers and others of \$1,758,290 (34.4%) offset by an increase in payments to suppliers and employees of \$1,295,428 (32.1%).

Net cash from investing activities

There was an increase in net cash outflows for investing activities by \$53,287 predominantly due to payments for property, plant and equipment of \$516,186 compared to \$467,449 in prior year.

Net cash from financing activities

There was a decrease in net cash outflows from financing activities by \$173,803 due to repayment of borrowings of \$407,587 compared to repayments of \$457,355 in prior year, offset by proceeds received from borrowings of \$227,167 compared to \$91,173 in prior year.

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GENERAL MANAGERS REPORT

It is with great pleasure I present the General Manager's Report for the 2022/2023 financial year which was the first year with uninterrupted trading since 2019.

As the financial reports show both companies Woolooware Golf Club Ltd and Woolooware Golf Course Management Pty Ltd have traded in a very positive manner this year with both being in sound cash positions.

This increased income has resulted in the paying out of the Club House renovation loan one (1) year in advance and assisting with much needed maintenance and upgrading of the Club House facilities. The increase in the cash flow for the golf course has enabled the Course Committee to push ahead with some capital works projects and put in place short and long term programs with the allocation of increased funds.

Golfing membership numbers across all categories have been excellent this year with waiting lists for membership having to be put in place for the first time in many years. TREASURER'S REPORT

Woolooware Golf Club Limited and its controlled entity (Woolooware Golf Course Mgt) returned an overall profit for the financial year ended 30th June 2023.

The net profit of \$679,328 was a good result against a net profit of \$153,374 in 2022.

Relevant details of each entity are set out below with a brief summary of items contributing to the positive financial position in comparison to 2022.

Revenue from bar trading increased by \$940,774 (66.5%)

Revenue from net poker machine takings increased by \$406,925 (66%)

Golf Course income increased by \$188,437 (12.5%)

Pro Shop income increased by \$263,177 (34%)

Financial costs decreased by \$22,969 (28.2%)

Total assets increased by \$579,550 with total liabilities decreasing by \$99,778.

Cash/Cash equivalents increased by \$569,682 (32.8%)

Financial liabilities decreased by \$169,084 (48.6%)

Operating lease liabilities decreased by \$131,030 (18.8%)

Woolooware Golf Course Management

Woolooware Golf Course Management (WGCM) returned a net profit of \$95,321 compared to a loss of (\$57,862) in 2022.

The return to favourable weather and course conditions resulting in good player numbers on the course enabled the good financial position to be achieved.

WGCM revenue was \$2,740,365 (2022: \$2,312,921) with cash reserves of \$966,181 (2022: \$842,921).

Total Equity was \$1,198,833 (2022: \$1,103,512).

Woolooware Golf Club Limited

Woolooware Golf Club Limited (WGC) returned a net profit of \$584,007 (2022: \$211,236).

WGC revenue was \$4,101,269 (2022: \$2,733,715) with cash reserves of \$1,339,785 (2022: \$893,363).

Total Equity was \$2,494,574 (2022: \$1,910,567).

The increase in trade in the Club House across all revenue streams has resulted in a decrease in financial liabilities of \$178,963 with the CBA loan for the renovation and extension of the dining and function space being fully paid out one year in advance.

DIRECTOR OF GOLF REPORT

The past 12 months has been a complete contrast to the previous couple of years. With Covid restrictions lifted and the course drying out after the floods, we have finally been able to get back to some sort of normality. A lot of people either took up golf, or returned to golf during the pandemic and it seems as though the majority of those people are still playing. Player numbers remain strong with 62,926 players having a game at Woolooware in the 2022/23 financial year. At the time of writing this report, we are on target to reach 70,000 players in the 2023 calendar year, which will be the best numbers we have had in close to 20 years. The focus will now be on retaining these players.

We will have both a Junior Pennant team and an Encourage Shield team representing Woolooware Golf Club this year. This shows us that the system we have in place to progress kids from the Woolooware Golf Academy into club membership is working well. I continually receive positive feedback about how our cadets and junior members behave on the golf course. This can be attributed to the fact that our coaches Barry Bent and Adam Short ensure that they work on both technical skills and on-course behaviour.

To our sponsors, thank you for your continued support of Woolooware Golf Club. Please support these local businesses the same way that they have supported us. Finally, a big thank you to John McMahon, the Board and all of the staff at Woolooware. Without everyone playing their part, we wouldn't be in such a good position today.

COURSE SUPERINTENDENTS REPORT 2023

For the period 1/1/2023 - 12/9/2023 there has been 689mm of rainfall, which is a 68% decrease from this time last year.

The course has seen major improvements in the past year with substantial flood recovery works being undertaken on multiple areas of the course, to rejuvenate the course after the wettest year ever recorded in 2022.

For the most part, we have had favourable weather so far this calendar year, which has allowed us to complete our regular maintenance activities as well as other project/remediation work on the course. These works include:

- Restoration of the fairway surfaces that were permanently damaged from severe flooding in 2022. A combination of techniques including scarifying, aerating, slicing, installation of new turf and soil amendments were utilised to make these improvements in a short timeframe.
- Scarification and aeration of all tee surfaces as well as greens collars.
- Installation of a new irrigation control panel to allow for improved functionality of our existing pumps supplying irrigation to the course.
- Distribution of existing stockpile of mulch built up from the previous wet weather periods, with mulch added to areas on 6th,7th and 8th holes. This task couldn't have been completed without the many volunteers who were involved in the project.
- Dredging of 16th dam to remove silt deposits from previous rain events over the past few years.
- Currently undergoing reconstruction of 9th tee and its surrounding areas
- Installation of new boundary fencing along Woolooware Road behind 8th green, 9th tee and 10th hole areas. Fencing work also completed along the northern side of 5th fairway.
- Concrete pathway installed eastern side of 7th fairway to allow much improved access in this area of the course during wet periods, new concrete path has also been installed as part of the 9th tee project.
- 3rd members and social teeing areas have been levelled and turfed, with these areas scheduled to open October 2023.
- Restoration of course furniture on tee's is currently being upgraded, will gradually be rolled out over the next 12 months.

We have successfully completed green renovations in August and the greens surfaces are recovering well. Cutting and rolling programs have now recommenced. We will continue to see the benefits of these practices in the coming months as soil/air temperatures continue to rise.

Thanks to the course maintenance team for their major role in rejuvenating the golf course after an extremely difficult period, following the wettest year on record.

Thanks to the volunteers for the completion of various maintenance and project tasks throughout the year. Your efforts are much appreciated by the staff and the wider golfing community of Woolooware Golf Club.

Thanks to John McMahon our General Manager, and to all committee members and directors, for your continued support of the greens staff throughout the year.

- 1. A list of disclosures, declarations and returns made by the Governing body and employees of the Club.
- 2. The salary bands of the Club's top executives.
- 3. Details of the overseas travel made by the governing body and employees of the Club.
- 4. Details of loans given by the Club to employees.
- 5. Details of certain contracts executed by the Club.
- 6. Salary details of Club employees who are close relatives of a member of the Club's governing body or a top executive.
- 7. Details of the payments made by the Club for consultant services.
- 8. Details of legal settlements made by the Club with a member of the governing body or an employee of the Club.
- 9. Details of legal fees paid by the Club for a member of the governing body of an employee of the Club.
- 10. The Club's annual gaming machine profit.
- 11. The amount applied by the Club to community development and support.

AND

The Club must prepare quarterly financial statements for the governing body that incorporate:

- 1. The Club's profit and loss accounts and trading accounts for the quarter and
- 2. A balance sheet as at the end of the quarter
